AHI 279: Contemporary Architecture

BOOK REVIEW



ASSIGNMENT DESCRIPTION

- Write a book review of Danish architect Bjarke Ingel's architectural manifesto, Yes Is More.
- Your review should not be a summary or description of the book, but rather a critical analysis of the text. It should be similar in tone, style, and content to your commentary assignments.
- Questions to consider (you do not need to answer each of these questions in your review, they are meant to serve as a guide):
 - O What is the author's point of view?
 - o Who is the author?
 - O What type of book Is this?
 - O What does the title mean?
 - O How does this book relate to the architect's work?
 - O Why did the author write this book?
 - o Is the book a marketing tool? If so, is it related to other marketing strategies?
 - O Who was the intended audience?
 - How does this text relate to other similar texts (i.e. other architectural manifestoes, treatises, and writing by contemporary architects)?
 - What does the book look like? (Think about cover design, page layout, etc).
 - O What themes or motifs stand out?
- There are a few book reviews in the text by Ada Louise Huxtable, and I recommend reading them as inspiration for your review. It may also be helpful to read some other reviews about Bjarke Ingel's text available online.

- You book review should be 4 pages maximum in length (3.5 pages minimum).
