- 6. What is a realistic timeline? (Please include intermittent steps as needed.)
- 7. What are the greatest challenges going to be? (Points of resistance, political issues, possible pitfalls?)
- 8. What are some of the strategies you are thinking about to overcome those potential challenges?
- 9. How will you turn this work into an ongoing process of utilizing data to improve student learning?
